

In April, Healthy Start Manatee presented the area's inaugural Home Visiting Symposium, which brought together 67 home visiting professionals from eight local agencies for a day of learning and sharing. Attendees learned new strategies for enrollment and retention in programs for parents and caregivers, so that they receive maximum benefits through the Coordinated Intake & Referral system, developed by Healthy Start, in partnership with our sister home visiting agencies.



The goal of the symposium was to celebrate and support the invaluable efforts of our community's home visitors to provide the best services possible to children and families in Manatee County. Community Outreach and Education



Healthy Start is always grateful for opportunities to reach out and connect with the community and families who might benefit from our programs, services, or referrals. During the spring, we had the chance to collaborate with various organizations and community partners on outreach activities and events. For example, in March, our care coordinator team shared information on Healthy Start services and Maternal Child Health with families at a literacy fair sponsored by The Learning Experience, a local early childhood education center.

In May, the Healthy Start team attended the unveiling of the Manatee County Judicial Center's New Parent Nursing Center and provided educational materials for new parents to access when using the room. Local attorney, and new mom, Melissa Casanueva, and her colleague Bryony Swift, received a grant from the Manatee County Bar Association's Young Lawyers Division to create this critically important community resource. It's now open to parents/caretakers conducting business in the building who need to feed their babies or pump breast milk. This is such a great asset for our community!

Manatee Community Baby Shower

This year, Healthy Start Manatee was thrilled to have the opportunity to partner with the Department of Health in Manatee County (DOH-Manatee), the Early Learning Coalition of Manatee County (ELC), and Palmetto Boys & Girls Club to present the first annual Manatee Community Baby Shower, where we were able to engage families in a fun event, while offering education to help prevent the leading causes of infant mortality.

Twenty-five community partners exhibited at the shower,

providing useful health and parenting information to the more than 30 families who attended, 90% of whom reside in Manatee County's high risk zip codes where poor birth outcomes are more likely.



Exhibitors also donated fantastic door prizes for attendees, including baby gift baskets, diapers, books, pampering self-care goodies for mom, gift cards, a car seat, and a grand prize stroller! Key information highlights included infant safe sleep, breastfeeding and nutrition, and tobacco/nicotine use prevention. Everyone went home with lots of great educational materials, prizes and give-aways!

Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS) Initatives



Since June 2017, Healthy Start Manatee has been working alongside community stakeholders to address the growing number of babies born substance exposed in Manatee County. In 2016, 70 babies were born substance exposed at Manatee Memorial Hospital. Community Relations Manager Lauren Blenker spearheads the NAS Task Force alongside Katie Powers, RN, IBCLC, Manatee Memorial Hospital/

MOMM's Place and Sharon Kramer, M.Ed., CPP, Executive Director, Drug Free Manatee. Since establishing the task force a year ago, we've

made great strides in impacting this issue. Examples include: strengthening communication amongst community partners, identifying and promoting available resources, providing program presentations to incarcerated pregnant women at Manatee County Jail, and developing literature and educational material for target populations.

Additionally, Executive Director Fred Leonard has been actively involved in the planning of the upcoming "Regional Summit: The Opioid-Addicted Pregnant Patient and Substance Exposed Neonate." Charlotte, Desoto, Manatee and Sarasota counties will all play active roles in the summit, which will feature national speakers, breakout sessions, county updates and more. Effective August 1, 2018, Healthy Start Manatee will have a new home--well, two new homes to be exact. Healthy Start Manatee Risk Screening Data

The Healthy Start system of care utilizes a one-page risk screening tool for obstetric and pediatric providers, as well as other health professionals to identify and refer women and infants who may benefit from our program. This collaborative system helps ensure that women who need our services are able to readily access them.

The Florida Department of Health collects prenatal and infant screening data on a regular basis for all counties. Between July 1, 2017 and May 31, 2018, 2,801 pregnant women have been screened, making Manatee County's prenatal screening rate 88.7%. In addition, 2,694 mothers of infants were screened, making the infant screening rate 85.3%.
