### Professional Development to Best Support the Health & Wellbeing of Moms & Babies

Over the last few months our Care Coordination and Coordinated Intake & Referral teams expanded their knowledge base and gained tools to enhance their one-on-one education and support services with pregnant and new mothers.



On the heels of National Breastfeeding Awareness Month, the presenter at our General Membership Meeting (GMM) in September featured our very Charlene Chirillo, BSN, RN, ICCE, CBC. Her presentation, "Breastfeeding 101," provided our team, and other attendees, with practical tips on how to most effectively support and guide clients to breastfeed their babies successfully. For example, holding baby skin-to-skin for 2 hours after birth can increase breastfeeding success by 80%!

Our team members also attended a three-day Breastfeeding Counselor Course in October, presented by Mirine Dye, MPH, IBCLC, and held at Step Up Suncoast. It was a fantastic professional development opportunity to





help them assist moms with breastfeeding promotion, initiation and problem solving.



Our October and November GMMs focused on women's reproductive health topics, including pelvic floor and vaginal health. Christin Caviness, DPT, CKTP, with Fitness Quest Physical Therapy, presented "Pelvic Floor Physical Therapy," where she shared insightful information on how to help our clients with pregnancy/postpartum-related pelvic and back pain, such as tailbone alignment issues and split abdominal muscles. She discussed techniques, such as breathing exercises, to help regain full working mechanics of the musculoskeletal system.

Paola Ferst, MS, with Planned Parenthood of Southwest and Central Florida, presented "Vaginal Health and Wellness," which delved into some of the more common health concerns women deal with, such as cervical cancer, HPV & PAP tests, helpful hygiene tips to share with clients and other prevention information, as well as the importance of well woman visits and corresponding screenings.



Most recently in December, several of our care coordinators participated in Centerstone's Sexual Assault and Trauma Services division's day-long workshop, "Referrals Training for Health & Social Service Providers Working with Women Who Experience Unintended Pregnancy." This unique training covered essential skills and information to understand barriers for women accessing reproductive health care, identify referral behaviors that respect clients' confidentiality and right to make their own decisions, and learn a model for effective referral-making.

#### **Community & Family Outreach and Education**

We are passionate about maternal child health and want to make sure moms and families have the information they need to make healthy decisions for themselves and their babies, so we love community events where we can do this on a broad scale!

Over the last few months, the Healthy Start team engaged in education, outreach activities, and community networking at various events, including the Back to School Family Fun Day at Church of Hope, the Salvation Army's Christmas programs' family registration events, the Gulf Coast Latin Chamber's Hispanic Heritage Month Conexiones event, held at our community partner's, MCR Health, the School District of Manatee County's Migrant Family Resource Fair, and the Home Visiting Coalition's Holiday Party for Families. Our team members shared information on Healthy Start services, maternal infant health, and related topics such as safe sleep, family planning, breastfeeding, community resources, and early literacy.

#### **Healthy Start Manatee Risk Screening Data**

The Healthy Start system of care utilizes a one-page risk screening tool for obstetric and pediatric providers, as well as other health professionals to identify and refer women and infants who may benefit from our program. This collaborative system helps ensure that women who need our services are able to readily access them.

The Florida Department of Health collects prenatal and infant screening data on a regular basis for all counties. Between July 1 and October 31, 2018, 989 pregnant women have been screened, making Manatee County's prenatal screening rate 83.6%. In addition, 1,004 mothers of infants were screened, making the infant screening rate 84.8%.
