charged with improving maternal and child




Local Maternal Child Health Trends

Close to 20% of pregnant women are uninsured; Manatee ranks 6th highest in the state for births to uninsured women (Pregnancy and Young Child Profile, FL CHARTS)

Overall, Manatee County has 24% uninsured rate and EL has 25% which is 2nd highest in State of the States, Midyear 2009 Gallup-Health busuance; 90 Unionsured Health Busuance; 90 Unionsur

Local Maternal Child Health Trends Con't


34% of pregnant women receive late or no prenatal care (FLDOH Health Problem Analysis 2010)

Community Campaigns & Collaborations

Teen Pregnancy Prevention: In collaboration with the Healthy Teens Coalition of Manatee County and the School District, Healthy Start engages in community awareness efforts and direct interventions with pregnant/parenting teens.

Prescription-drug Exposed Infants: In partnership with the Manatee County Substance Abuse Coalition, local medical experts, and impacted families Healthy Start is focused on prevention, education and advocacy among all stakeholders, including doctors, women of childbearing age, and elected officials/policy makers.

Community Campaigns & Collaborations Cont'd

Infant Safe Sleep Campaign (SIDS/SUIDS prevention): In partnership with the Manatee Sheriff's Office, Manatee Educational Television, and other community partners Healthy Start engages clients and the community at large on how to prevent accidental infant sleep deaths.

CHART Manatee: Healthy Start is a charter member of the Community Health Action Response Team (CHART), which works to develop and implement health policies in the community, such as workplace breastfeeding policies.

Impact

2,755 women and infants - from among 3,165 births - received Healthy Start direct services in FY 2011-12 (through May 31)

Risk screening of patients was conducted at a rate of 91% by OB/GYN and pediatric providers

Healthy Start engaged over 1,500 community members on MCH topics at 20 community events
